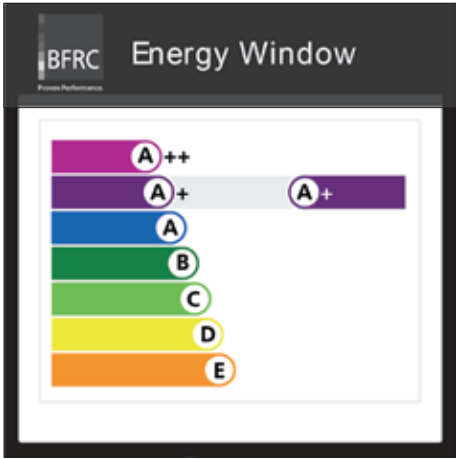

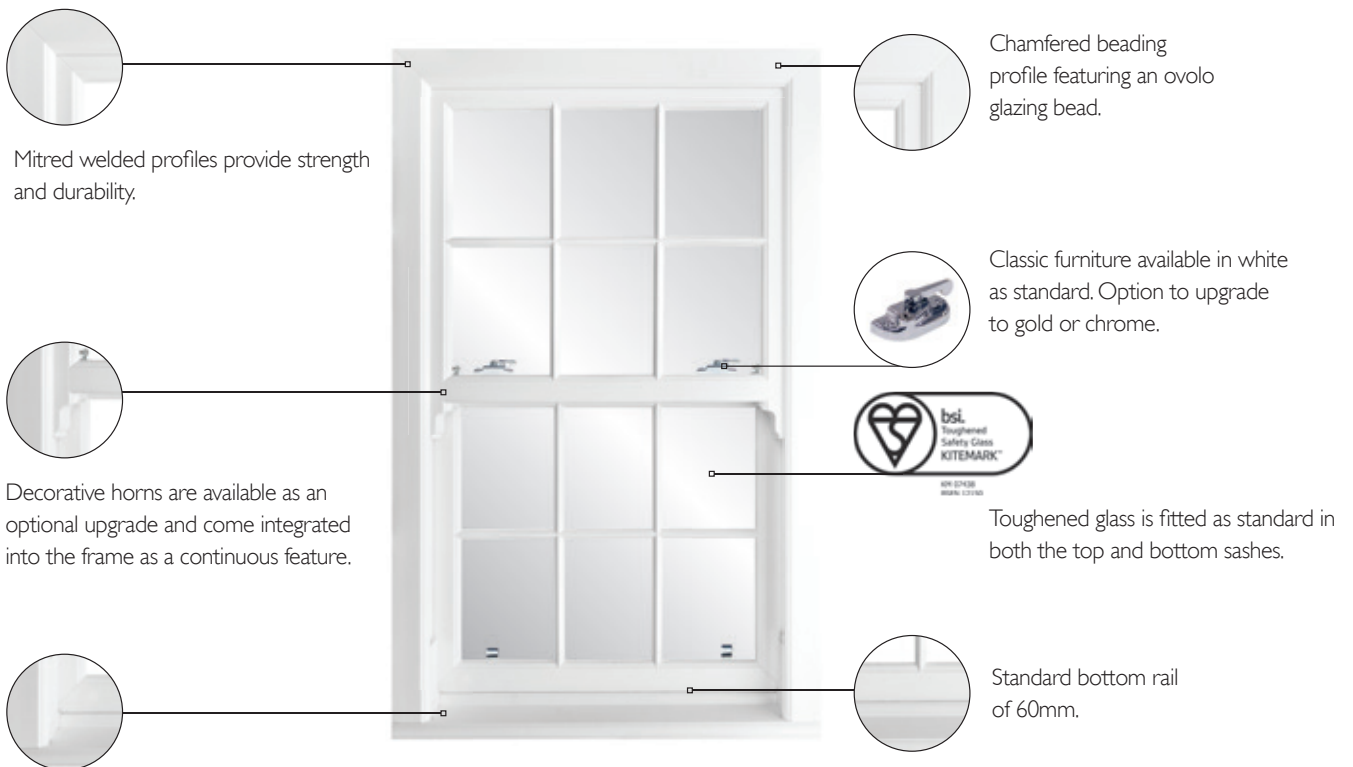

They are designed to replicate the classic look of traditional Timber sashes, while incorporating 21st century security levels and an outstanding level of thermal efficiency.

Flying Mullion

A mullion is the vertical member on to which the casements close. A flying mullion, however, is an integral part of one of the casements so that, when both casements are open, you have a clear and unimpeded view of the outside. When closed, it resembles a standard casement window and locks securely in place. Flying mullions on windows were first introduced as a means of fire escape and, although they can be used for aesthetic reasons, their principal purpose is still one of safety.



Fully Reversible Window

Designed to invite maximum light into your room, the fully reversible window is ideal for higher built properties. The 180-degree reversible opening mechanism pivots within the axis of the hinge without protruding into the room to allow easy, safe and secure cleaning of the external glass from the inside of the property.

Timber window styles

Flush Finish Casement

For an extremely authentic look, particularly suited to older properties, all casements are designed to sit completely flush with the window frame when shut and are hinged to open outwards, as either top hung or side hung vents. Weatherproofing keeps the draughts out, and the option of restrictor hinges can be selected for modern day safety and security. Despite the traditional appearance of our flush finish casements they still achieve a very modern energy efficiency of A-rated as standard, so you stay cosy even on the chilliest days.



Stormproof Casement

These windows are designed with performance in mind and are often suited to more contemporary homes. While they sympathetically replicate the look of traditional Timber casement windows, the frame is double rebated and the casement stands proud. This creates an overlap when the window is closed which provides additional protection against the weather and helps keep draughts at bay. The windows open outwards as either top hung or side hung vents and achieve an energy efficiency rating of A as standard.

Sliding Sash

Traditional Timber sash windows originated in the 17th century. We're proud to be maintaining this element of our heritage while enabling homeowners to feel more snug and secure.

Each of our Timber sliding sash windows are individually made with your choice of frame and glass.

They combine the natural beauty of real Timber with the modern performance features that make them smooth to open and draught-free when closed.



Secondary Glazing styles

Side Hinged

If you already have single opening casement windows, we can make you a hinged secondary glazing unit to help keep your home quieter, warmer and draught free. The extra layer of glass will also make your home safer from intruders, as it's harder to break-in.

These will be fitted by expert installers who'll take the time to show you exactly how to operate them.



Vertical

Adding secondary glazing is a great way to keep warm and to help shut out the noisy outside world. It's especially effective if you can't replace your existing windows because you live in a listed building or a conservation area.

For example, if your home has original sliding sash windows, we can make you a vertical sliding unit. These operate with spring balance so they can be easily opened and they also have a tilt facility, which makes them easy to clean.



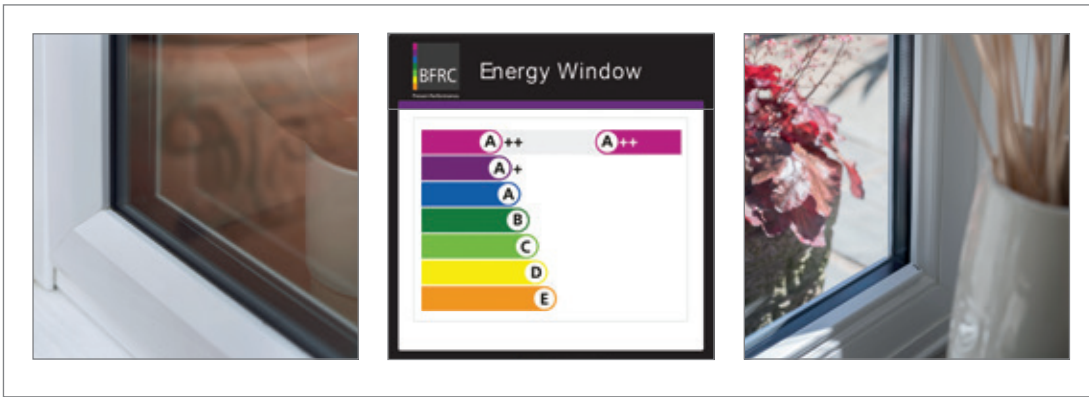
Horizontal

Every one of our secondary glazing units is built individually by our skilled craftspeople in our UK factory. You can be confident they are not only of the highest quality, but will fit your existing windows perfectly, whatever their shape or size.

If your existing windows open horizontally we can make matching units for between two to five casements. And all the panels slide, which makes them really easy to open and close.

Energy efficiency...

helping reduce your fuel bills

Window design, and the technology behind window manufacture, has developed at an amazing rate over the last couple of decades.

One of the most significant changes has been in thermal and energy efficiency, in other words, how windows keep the cold out and the warmth in, how well they do that and therefore how much energy and money you can save as a result.



How a window is rated...

for energy efficiency

Our windows are independently assessed by the British Fenestration Rating Council (BFRC). This gives a numerical rating in kilowatt hours per square metre per year ($\text{kWh}/\text{m}^2/\text{year}$), which translates to an A++ to E rating. The BFRC scheme is Britain's nationally recognised system for rating the energy efficiency of windows and is recognised within the Building Regulations as a method to show compliance for replacement window installations.

The energy index is an important factor, indicating the amount of energy lost or gained by the window. The value is displayed in kilowatt-hours (kWh) per square metre of glazing (m^2) per year. A positive value indicates that the window lets more heat in through the glass, than is being lost out through the window. The higher the number, the greater the energy savings.

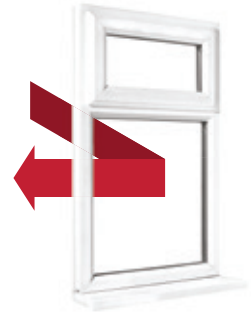


Thermal Transmittance (U window) 1.0 W/m² .K

1. Thermal Transmittance

This measures how good a window is at preventing heat from escaping from inside the building. The lower the transmittance value, often referred to as the U-value, the better the product is at preventing heat loss.

The lower the U Value, the warmer your home will be.



Solar Factor (g window) 0.38

2. Solar Factor

This measures the amount of heat gained from sunlight passing through the glass. The solar factor is expressed as a number between 0 and 1. The more transparent the glass, the higher the solar gain. The higher the number, the better the window is at capturing the sun's heat particularly during the winter months.

The higher the G Factor, the more free energy you harvest.

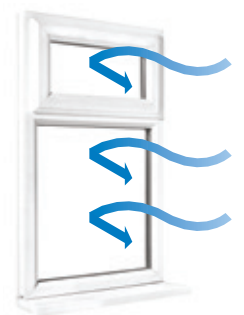


Effective Air Leakage (L factor) 0.00 W/m² .K

3. Air Leakage

This measures how 'air tight' the window is. A lower air leakage number means less air leakage through the window from the outside when the window is shut. In other words, it is less 'draughty'. Less air leakage equates to less heat escaping.

The lower the L Factor, the less draughty your windows will be.



The combination of all three factors provides you with the overall Energy Index and your overall energy rating.

Saving you money... and using less energy

Save money

By using the energy calculator developed by the Glass and Glazing Federation (GGF) – the leading trade federation in the glass and glazing industry – we are able to calculate the potential cost and energy savings for a property if the windows were upgraded from pre 2002 double glazed uPVC windows to new A+ rated uPVC triple glazed windows from Everest, you could save up to £196.06* per year in energy costs, which equates to 0.51 tonnes of CO₂.

Environmental savings too

By consuming less energy, you are also helping the environment, as using less energy means fewer CO₂ emissions.

The size of CO₂ emissions is hard to visualise but 1 tonne of CO₂ is equivalent to driving 6000km in a diesel car – that's from London to Greece and home again![†]

We also play our part, as members of Recoviny! Plus, an initiative of the European PVC industry who monitor and verify the recycling of PVC waste, helping us to improve our production processes, minimise our emissions and boost the collection and recycling of our waste.

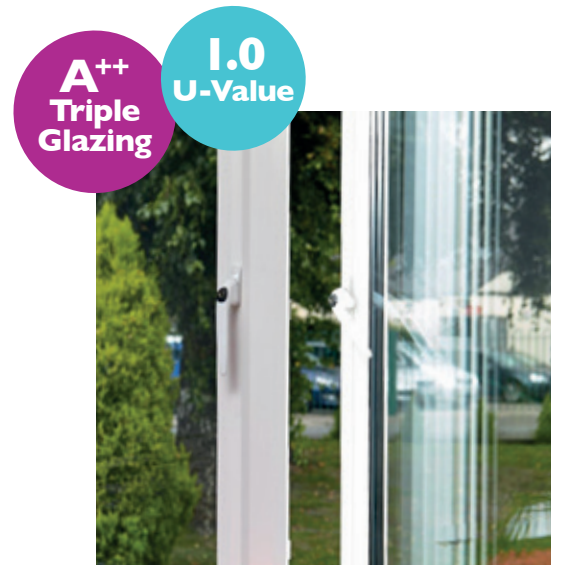

That's because all our triple glazed sealed units are filled as standard with an inert gas, which is a great insulator in narrow cavities and therefore further inhibits the transfer of heat between the glass panes. To maximise the sun's energy, they also feature two panes of Low-E glass and one pane of Low-Iron glass, the invisible metal coating on Low-E glass reflects heat back into your room, helping to make it much warmer and reduce energy bills. The extra layer of glass also provides additional sound proofing and an even greater level of security.

Thermally optimised enhancements to the frame and glass also results in less heat escaping, a real plus for the energy efficiency of your home.

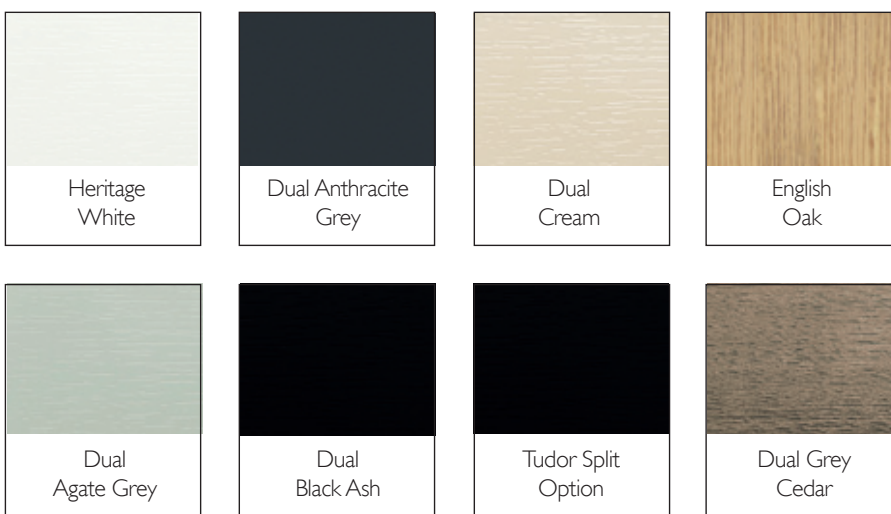

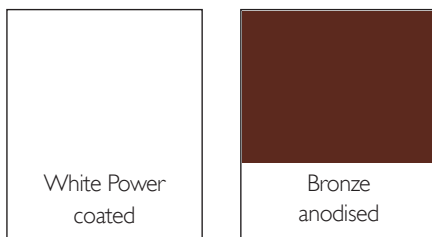

Advanced safety and security features for maximum peace of mind are an integral aspect in the design and construction of every Everest product.

Whichever window style you choose in whichever material, we have designed them to withstand forced entry by the opportunist thief with a range of tried and tested, high security features.

Unless you specify otherwise, all windows are fitted with key lockable handles. On our uPVC casement windows, for instance, these operate highly efficient shoot bolts passing through the strong steel keeper plates and into the frame in at least two points, which gives extra security against forced entry and helps keep the casement closed firmly into the frame.

Our uPVC windows are also internally glazed and beaded, which makes it difficult for the glass unit to be prised out from the outside.

The extra layer of glass in our A+ rated triple glazed windows also brings enhanced security and safety to your home further preventing opportunist thieves from breaking through your glass.

In locations where the building regulations require, we can also fit fire egress hinges and toughened glass for security and safety.

If you have any concerns about security or would like further details on our security features and additional options on your chosen window style, just ask us.

Shoot bolt locks

High security steel shoot bolts lock into the frame at two points.



Excluder device

High security anti-jimmy device resists forcing.



Key locking handles

Key locking security handles are fitted as standard.



Strong construction

Robust multi-chambered uPVC construction with welded joints for added strength.



Internal glazing

By internally fitting the beading it means the glass cannot be removed from the outside. This makes your windows more secure.



Toughened glass

Where legally required Everest fit safety glass as standard. If broken it will disintegrate into small granular pieces.



Ventilation

Trickle vents provide the required Building Regulation standard for continuous ventilation.

Glazing styles

Etched

Etched glass is a range of designs suitable for areas where a degree of privacy is required. The subtlety of etched glass looks understated and offers both contemporary and traditional designs. This glazing style is available in both our double and triple glazed windows.

Etched glass options

One of the first steps in choosing decorative glass is to decide whether you want to enhance the beautiful view outside, or create a stylish way to prevent the outside world from looking in. Before you pick the overall design, select the appropriate obscurity level based on where the glass will be located and what you're looking to achieve.

Glass styles



Positive: The pattern is sandblasted onto clear glass, but the windows are mainly transparent.

Ideal for: Windows and conservatory windows with a view.



Negative: The background is sandblasted onto clear glass, the design is the only transparent area.

Ideal for: Windows without views e.g. looking out to a wall or fence.

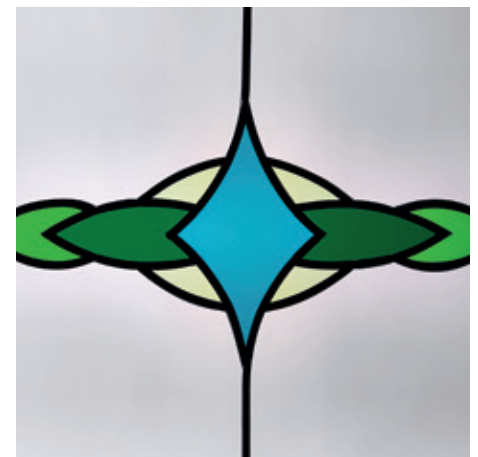


Silver Mist: The pattern is sandblasted onto Silver Mist glass, to give you full privacy.

Ideal for: Bathroom windows.

Coloured

Coloured glass is often used to create a traditional stained glass window effect. It's stunning when added to a simple, standalone design, or it can make a real impact when the design is run across a series of panes, such as in a conservatory or around a bay window.



Bevelled

Bevelled glass designs manage to look both modern and classic at the same time. They're just right for adding a sophisticated 'architectural' look and are equally beautiful when kept clear and neutral, or when they're used to inject some subtle colour.



Brilliant Cut

Brilliant cut creates crisp, clean lines for a subtle yet sophisticated effect which still allows plenty of light to flood in. The diamond cut provides a stylish alternative to traditional diamond leading or you could welcome the sun into your home by adding a classic sunburst design to an arched window or a Regency gable end conservatory.
